Write team names in here. Circle "**Kick Off**", if they kick the ball off to start the game.

Ensure that you do the following:

- Put a score for each half, for visitor and home. If they do not score, write the number '0'.
- Ensure that you put the final score in the "Final Score" box for each game.
- For the referee/assistant information area, **do not sign the card until the end of the game**. When you sign this card your signature is not only for your pay purposes, but that you also agree with the score written on the card, and that the card is completed properly. You are responsible for ensuring that the score is tallied properly in the "Final Score" area of the card, prior to the card being turned in.
- The center referee must ensure that they write all yellow cards in the referee comment area. Also ensure that you make commentary if the team was exhibiting a lot of dissent and you gave them a warning. This includes players, spectators, and the coach. This is a prelude if you later have to caution, or expel a spectator, coach, or player, for dissent.

Cards are typically directed to the referees on **field #1**, for handing in. The referee assignor is responsible for collecting the cards, by making arrangements with the field #1 referee.

For the back of the game card, the coach is totally responsible. They must insure that they have a ‘sticky’ team roster for the back of the card, or something to stick their roster on the back of the card. They especially must ensure that they sign the roster list, as the bottom, where the coaches signature is required. This must be signed by a registered coach/assistant coach of the team. No one else may sign for them. You must have a coaches pass for anyone that signs the card. The card must also include player numbers in the “No.” section. The ‘CYSA No.’ is not required.

If a card is not completely properly, the pay for the parties on the card will be delayed until the card is verified, for any item in question.
